About the University

Mediterranean University Podgorica was founded on May 30, 2006, in Podgorica, as the first private university in Montenegro. During the past decade of work, we have grown into an eminent higher education institution that realizes its teaching and scientific activities through nine study programs in undergraduate studies, ten study programs in specialist studies, eleven in master's programs and two study programs in doctoral studies. The University is an accredited and licensed institution consisting of six faculties:

- Faculty of Tourism "Montenegro Tourism School"
- Faculty of Economics and Business
- Faculty of Information Technology
- Faculty of Visual Arts
- Faculty of Foreign Languages
- Faculty of Law

The University is clearly and thoughtfully committed to systematically improving the quality of studies in order to be modern, flexible, comparable, competitive, and efficient. In that sense, and in accordance with the Bologna process, we continuously work on raising the quality level of all university activities: teaching, study programs, grading system based on the introduction of the European credit accumulation and transfer system - ECTS, textbooks and literature, classroom and other space, information system, scientific research activities, publishing activities, selection of teaching and administrative staff, library activities, continuing education and other standards.

All study programs are accredited and licensed in accordance with the positive regulations of Montenegro. The university received a license to operate on August 31, 2006, and since then twice (in 2008 and 2013) it has been very successful in the process of re-accreditation of the institution and study programs in accordance with national regulations.







Our mission

The mission of the UM is to contribute to the society by "educating professionals in the fields of social sciences, law and economics, engineering and technology, arts and others, by applying international standards of teaching and learning to enable mobility to other Universities, application and transfer of knowledge".



Studies

Studies at Mediterranean University are organized and implemented in the framework of the Bologna declaration. The basic model of studies is 3+2+3;

Meaning that undergraduate studies last three academic years, post-graduate (masters) studies last two years and doctoral studies have the duration of three academic years.

The academic year is divided into two semesters worth 30 ECTS each, which means the full academic year is worth 60 ECTS.







Faculties

1. Faculty of Visual Arts

At the Faculty of Visual Arts learning springs from the essence and the intuitive-vocational work of the staff which is, on average, probably the youngest in the country. The studies are conducted in two cycles, bachelor and master. At the Faculty of Visual Arts, the students absorb the harmony between the art-and-craft and the theoretical and the cognitive. We don't create operators, but future directors in creative industries. The FVA promotes the following mottos:

- There are no two problems alike. Creativity knows no boundaries. Functionalism gives birth to fascism on its own.
- If it is not working, try something else. Take risks, but don't gamble. From chaos something wonderful is born
- The satisfaction is both the goal and the journey. No gender is more creative than the other.
- Defeats are the source of creativity. Down with the Status Quo!

The studies at the FVA lead to the vocation of a visual artist that the student alone defines by combining eight modules: design, illustration, photography, animation, video, space, sound and the fine art fields. The diploma is recognised in the ECTS system and through the Lisbon convention, as well as the ISCED global classification (UNESCO). From the FVA, we advise that drawing does not mean creating, building, filming, talking, writing. Only the intention and the attitude are the measures of creativity.

2. Faculty of Foreign Languages

The contemporary programmes at the Faculty of Foreign Languages fit the profile of a modern philologist aiming towards the application of language in different professions and occupations.

We offer the diverse range of knowledge and skills to students through two modules: Business English Language and English Teaching, which help them become more competitive in the job market in the country and abroad. Additional motivation and diversification of the educational content are achieved thanks to the quality organisation of events like creative writing workshops, panels, film projections, lecture at partnering institutions, and organisation of professional practise in language and translation schools.

The students of the Faculty of Foreign Languages take part in the international global exchange programmes. Thanks to the collaboration with numerous higher education institutions in Europe, our students have a chance to apply for an exchange through the Erasmus+ programme and spend a semester at one of the renowned European universities.

The highly qualified staff of the faculty is made up of professors and assistants who continually work on self-improvement and enable quality, substantial and thorough study of a language with the help of the most modern didactic and technological methods.

3. Faculty of Economics and Business

The Faculty of Economics and Business was founded in 2006 as the first private faculty in Montenegro for educating staff in the field of financial and marketing management. The Faculty is deeply devoted to educating the students by elevating the quality of high education nationally and regionally, by creating image-oriented and socially responsible organisations whose students will become experts upon finishing their studies, ready to successfully deal with all the contemporary work and social challenges. Accordingly, the programme and the literature used in class are in complete accordance with the European and world trends in education. The advantage of studying at our faculty is the education of staff specialised in the field of marketing, finance, accounting and revision. At the BA course, Economics and Business are studied. At the master's course, two programmes of academic studies have been developed: Finances and Marketing. Apart from the academic studies, the students have the possibility of enrolling at the Applied Master's studies in English (International MBA in Management, Finance and Agribusiness).

Visa Procedure

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs in cooperation with the Ministry of the Interior is in charge of processing visa requests of foreign students. The requests are to be submitted to the Embassy of Montenegro in the country of origin of the student. Visa procedure usually takes a few working days, and the entire procedure can take up to 10 days, though sometimes it is completed in at a shorter time notice. Accomodation

Some of

the exchange students, the same as a number of Montenegrin ones, are renting. The prices vary, depending on the type of accommodation (room, studio, apartment, distance from the faculty), between 200 and 600 € a month. Students quite often share a flat in order to reduce the price. The Office for International Cooperation can help the students find the appropriate accommodation. Many flats are available near most of the faculties and are usually rented by students.

Health Insurance


The exchange students themselves are responsible for obtaining insurance and bearing the insurance costs during mobility, unless otherwise stipulated by the concrete exchange programme. The insurance must cover: travel insurance, health insurance, general liability insurance for Third party, accident and serious illness coverage in a mandatory way depending on the type of the mobility. The IRO office shall provide to the selected candidates and sending institution all relevant information regarding insurance rules applicable for foreign students.

Montenegro has signed 25 bilateral agreements on social insurance i.e., social security, which allow for harmonized application of national legislations of the contracting states in the area of social insurance which guarantees equal treatment of citizens in each of the contracting states. The agreements ensure preservation of acquired rights and guarantee payments of benefits in case of change of residence from one to another contracting state.

The bilateral social security agreements regulate the rights to pension and disability and health insurance, health care and maternity, insurance in case of injury at work and occupational disease, unemployment insurance, child benefit, as well as administrative legal aid.

The states Montenegro has signed agreements with are listed below: Austria, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czech Republic, Denmark, Egypt, France, the Netherlands, Croatia, Italy, Libya, Luxemburg, Hungary, Macedonia, Norway, Germany, Poland, Slovenia, Serbia, Switzerland, Sweden, Great Britain, Republic Bulgaria, Republic of Turkey.
